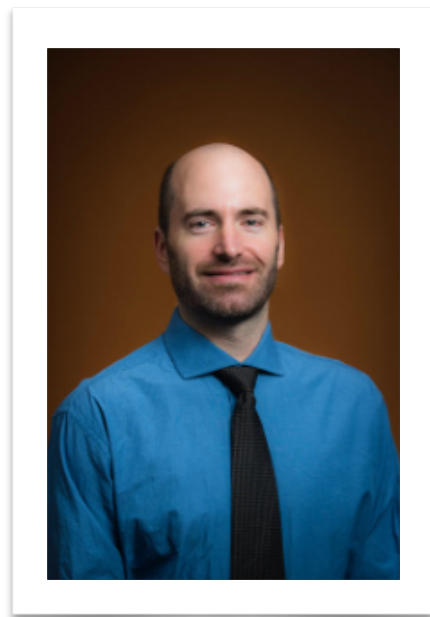

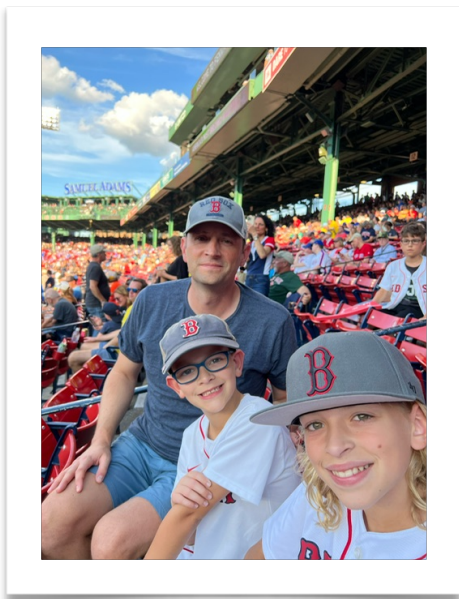
Theodore Foster, DO – General cardiologist,

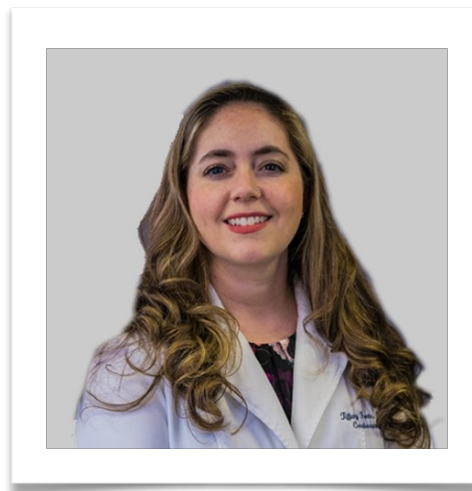

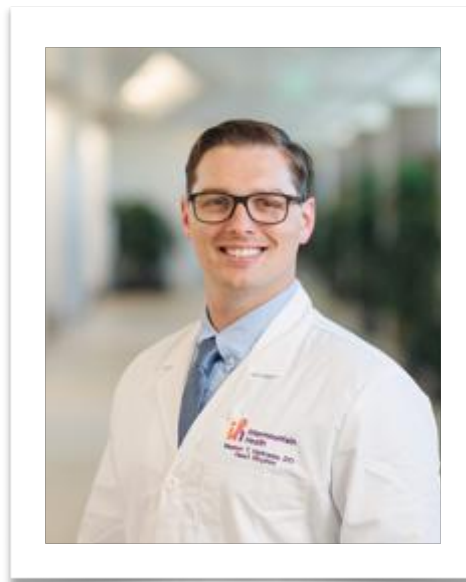
Tyler Earley, DO - General cardiologist, Good Samaritan Regional Medical Center, Corvallis, OR
